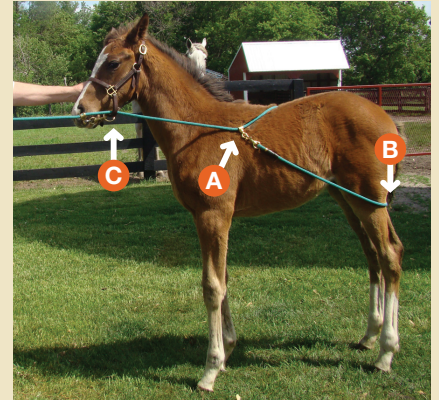
The Buck-Along

The **Buck-Along** is an adjustable rope with two thimbles and snaps. It is most useful from new born foals to larger colts, mules, donkeys, and mini's. It allows the handler to have full control of the animal and at the same time keep the head aligned with the body.

It can be adjusted as the foal, etc. gets larger and it is designed so that if it comes off the rump you are still snapped onto the animal itself.



Instructions: Snap the end snap (A) into the first thimble. (B) Adjust the length of the rope to fit over the rump, just above the hocks, and lengthen it so that the snap and first thimble are at the top of the withers. Tighten the screw (A) against the rope. Put the end of the rope under the jaw thru the halter as shown. Adjust the thimble and snap in front of the bottom ring on the halter and tighten the thimble screw (A) again. It will be pulling on the rump and at the same time keeping the head straight and in line with the body. To release, unhook the head snap first and let the colt move forward and pull the end of the rope back thru the halter and they will walk out of the butt loop.

Note: Always secure the thimble down tight against the rope when you make any adjustment!

The No-Buck

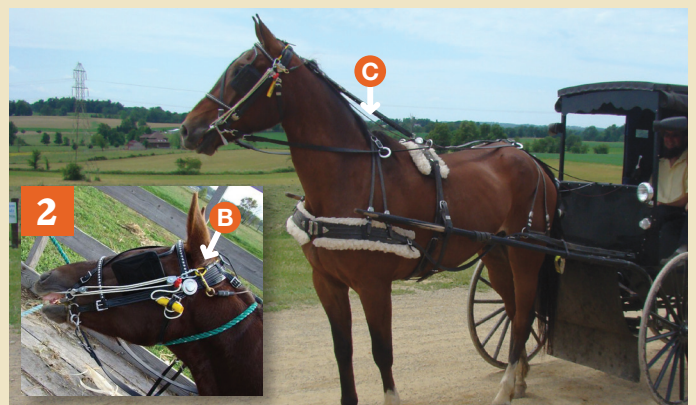
Step 1: Snap the right side snap of the **No-Buck** (A) below the heat shrink tubing on **The Stableizer**[®] cord (see picture 1) **Step 2:** Snap the left side into the loop of the cable just above the silver snap (B) on **The Stableizer**[®] (see *Stableizer Control Line* picture 2 below). **Step 3:** Adjust the long end of the **No-Buck** cord (C) to the saddle horn or what ever you are going to hook it to. Leave just enough slack so they can balance their head but not be able to get it down, maybe 2-3 inches is all that is needed.

Step 4: Put a slip knot into the end when you tie it off. We have found that this method has been a great help in not letting the animal learn to start bucking when they are first saddled. And we may use it the first 2 to 4 times that we start working them in the round pen and always on their first saddling.



The Stableizer Control Line ID #EZSCL70

We designed this piece of equipment primarily for the Amish in an effort to help control their buggy horses. It hooks up the same way as the **No-Buck** but is 12 feet long and it goes back into the buggy so the driver can help control any run off's or hard to handle horses (see picture).
